Payment Details

Tuition includes classes and costumes for the May dance recital. For your convenience, tuition is payable in six (6) payments. **Payments are due no later than the 10th of the month in: September, October, November, December, January and February.** Payment reminders are posted in the studio newsletters. Payment can be made online at dancinplus.com, dropped off at class time in the secured mailbox located in the studio lobby or mailed to Dancin' Plus Studio 310 S Hampton St. Fairmont, MN 56031.

There is a \$35.00 NSF fee for returned checks.

Payments made after the 10th of the month will result in a late fee of \$20.

Thank you for paying promptly. It is appreciated.

When you arrive for class

We appreciate it when dancers make every effort to arrive at class on time but please do not arrive more the 5 minutes before the start of class so as not to disrupt the class in session.

Unless you are the first class of the day, a class will be in session when you arrive. Please come into the studio quietly. Dancers should put on their ballet slippers unless specified differently.

Use cubbies and coat hooks for dance bags and coats. Please leave street shoes on the floor and not in the cubbies. Thank you!

If your dancer needs a bathroom break, before class is the best time to sneak into the bathroom. This way no class time is missed!

How you should arrive to class

Dancers should be dressed in proper dancewear when they arrive as we do not have changing rooms. Wear cover ups during cooler weather and simply layer dance clothes beneath. No sweatshirts or heavy coats allowed onto the dance floor. Once we get dancing, we warm up quickly! Hair **MUST** be pulled up and out of dancer's face. Be ready to dance! Having a small healthy snack before class is a great energy boost!

Dress code policy

Dancin' Plus follows attire requirements and the dress code must be followed—with the exception of special activities. Dancers need to be uniform and have the proper tools to be successful. Dancers' tools are their clothing, shoes and bodies, if the body is restricted by large, baggy clothing it makes it difficult to be successful.

What a dancer should wear:

Girls:

- Leotard (any color)
- Proper shoes- including the style and color required for class
 - Tights
 - Hair pulled back and out of the face
- Skirts, shorts or leggings (optional, most dancers do!)
 - T-shirt or form fitted long sleeves (optional)
 - Form-fitted activity jacket (optional)

Boys:

- Proper shoes- including the style and color required for class
- T-shirt or form fitted long sleeves
- Shorts or Black activity pants. (make sure they don't drag on the floor)
- Form-fitted activity jacket (optional)



What is **not** allowed:

- Baggy clothing – it's important for instructors to see the body movements to help dancers improve.
- Sweatshirts or hoodies.
- Pants – when pants are too long, they become a safety concern to our dancers. Baggy pants also don't allow the instructors to see the dancer's legs.
- Jewelry – broken jewelry can become very dangerous to our dancers – especially ones in pointe shoes. Jewelry can also be a distraction in class, even watches.

Thank you for being respectful!

The dance studio is a phone free zone. Ringing phones and conversations by waiting students and parents become disruptive for the dancers taking class. Students need to leave their cell phones in their dance bags so they can focus on class. Thank you so much for remembering the studio is a classroom and for being courteous to the instructors and students.

Picking up from class

The area outside the studio is a very busy place!

To keep our dancers and others safe:

- Please, be sure to come into the studio to get your young dancers. Our motto is "wait inside for your ride".
- Please, take time to legally park during drop off and pick up times. Please do not double park and block in others.
- Please, no dropping off or picking up students at the intersection at the stop sign on our corner.
- Please, do not stop in the road and have dancers hop out of the car and run through the traffic.

Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our students safe and helping us to try to eliminate the many complaints we receive each year about dance family parking issues.

Class absences

We do not offer refunds when a student misses class. We do not schedule make up classes when students need to miss class. We understand that a dancer may be sick and occasionally will miss class. We take that into consideration when we set our prices for the season. If you have a sick child, we know you are busy, so we do not require you to call with

absences. Please schedule dentist appointments, play dates, etc. for times other than dance class time. Good attendance is important and is a dancer's responsibility!

Dance class schedule

Because classes meet only once a week and we want to fit as many classes into the season as we can, breaks from school are not always breaks in our dance class schedule.

Our dancers come from many different school districts with different schedules, and it would be impossible to take a day off from dance when each school has a day off for MEA, school conferences and other school breaks.

If you follow our class schedule, you are sure not to miss dance class. You will receive a schedule in your enrollment packet. You can also keep an eye on our studio newsletters, website and Facebook page for reminders about our schedule.

Winter weather closures

To keep it simple for you, in the event of snowy weather, dance classes will be canceled if Fairmont Public Schools are canceled for the day or dismissed early. Once a school cancellation is announced, we will post it on our website, Facebook page and send out a remind message. If the weather turns "bad" AFTER dance classes begin for the evening, the studio will remain open for those who can make it. We will ALWAYS post snow day cancellations. Each class has two snow days built into the schedule. For classes with more than two snow days, we will reschedule.

Helpful reminders

- **No food, candy or gum in the studio.**
- **Covered water bottles are allowed.**
- **Dance bags and dance shoes need to be labeled with dancer's first and last name.**
- **Hair must be worn up and pulled away from the face.**
- **No jewelry.**
- **Only dance shoes on the dance floor.**
- **Take a restroom break BEFORE class.**
- **Only bring necessities in dance bags.**
- **Dancin' Plus is not responsible for misplaced items.**

A sneak peek

We do want to encourage you to sneak a peek at your dancer from time to time at the end of class, for just a few minutes. We ask that you do it quietly and without distraction. Please do

not stay for the entire class, it shortens your dancer's attention span and is disruptive to other dancers in class. We want your dancers to get the most out of their classes and we know you do too. Please be assured, if your child is having any difficulty in class, we will be sure to let you know.

Awards

We love to honor our dancers! It is customary within dance studios to acknowledge five, ten and fifteen year dancers. These are dancers that have taken classes at Dancin' Plus for that amount of consecutive dance seasons. First year pointe dancers receive a special pin to commemorate beginning this style of dance. In addition, each dancer taking part in the season receives an award to celebrate their year in dance.

Cast list T-shirts

Our dancers always look forward to the dance production cast list T-shirts. The front of the shirt shows our production theme in full color and the back has a cast list of all our performers. They make great souvenirs! We take orders for cast list T-Shirts in November.

Zero-tolerance for aggressive behavior

Dancin' Plus has a zero-tolerance policy for foul language, disrespectful language, yelling and any other aggressive behavior in the studio, dress rehearsal and at dance recital. Aggressive behaviors towards the owners, instructors, volunteers, performance staff, dancers and families are not tolerated. Violating this policy will result in immediate termination of contract, no future enrollment and no refund of classes already taken.

Dress rehearsal policy

Dress rehearsal is on the Friday before the dance recital weekend. It is required to attend! If you are not at dress rehearsal you will not be allowed to perform in the recital. Dress rehearsal is our only opportunity to be on the stage before performing. It's important dancers know their places and get a feel for the spacing. You should arrive to dress rehearsal as if it is a show day. This includes being dressed in costume, having dance shoes, hair pieces, make-up and hair done. This is your chance to make any adjustments needed before the show!

Dance Production

We want our students to have the magical experience of being in the spotlight of a fully costumed, staged production in a real theater. It is their time to shine! Because we know everyone has full, busy schedules, so that you can plan to participate, our production dates are announced well in advance. Participation is optional. If you plan to take part in

production weekend, your dancer will need to attend dress rehearsal and dance in their scheduled performances. If you plan to opt out, please let us know as soon as possible. Show choreography involving groups/ formations and partner work is designed for the number of dancers in the group. Each dancer plays an important part in the choreography looking the way it should.

We will order costumes in late November. If you opt out, we can refund your costume costs **ONLY** if costumes have not been ordered.

Parents have the opportunity to get in on the backstage fun as VIVs... **V**ery **I**mportant **V**olunteers. Watch for the sign-up sheet in the studio in early April.

Ticket sales help to cover the costs involved with Fairmont Junior Senior High School- Cardinal Center for Performing Arts rental, sound and lights and other recital expenses. We offer a convenient and easy to use online ticket box office that makes purchasing tickets so simple!

The April studio newsletter will “tip toe” you through everything you need to know to have a smooth sailing recital weekend.
